Dear Parents,

Next term we will be visited by the NSPCC who will be delivering their **'Speak Out Stay Safe'** assemblies to all children in our school and leading additional workshops for children in years 5 and 6. We will also be discussing the **NSPCC's PANTS rules** as part of our PSHE lessons which have been developed by the NSPCC to be like a Green Cross Code for staying safe from sexual abuse.

The aim is to teach our pupils the following important safety skills without giving explicit information or telling scary stories.

PANTS stands for:

- **Privates are private.**
- **Always remember your body belongs to you.**
- **No means no.**
- **Talk about secrets that upset you.**
- **Speak up, someone can help.**

The lessons will introduce a range of ideas, all delivered in a way that's fully age-appropriate, empowering pupils without using any frightening words.

These include:

- **good and bad touching**
- **your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable**
- **naming parts of the body**
- **who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried.**
