What an exciting and busy time we have had during the autumn term.

In Science, Year 1 and Year 2, in their own year groups, have learnt about the topic Humans and Animals. We have learnt so much about healthy eating and how we can keep our bodies fit and healthy. We have enjoyed completing lots of practical









Have a Happy Christmas!

In Design Technology, we have enjoyed investigating shell structures and creating our own 3D Christmas box. We found putting the structures together tricky; however, with a bit of determination, we have all produced a fantastically decorated box.





We have found our topic work on the Egyptians incredibly interesting. We have created timelines to represent the different periods and looked at when the Egyptians were in power compared to British history. Two areas we have enjoyed looking at in particular were the hieroglyphs and the process of making a mummy!

In Design Technology we were learning about 3D shell structures. We first investigated different boxes and the discussed the reason for the shape of each box. We then went on to design and make a money box for ourselves by drawing our own net for the box. The children then enjoyed assembling and decorating their money boxes.

The finished money boxes looked fabulous!
















In Science Year 4 have been learning about electricity. We made a circuit and then investigated how to use switches and buzzers. Mrs Shuttleworth gave us a challenge of making a switch using a piece of card and 2 paper clips. We had to use this to make the circuit work. We managed it! Year 5 have been enjoying learning about forces with Miss Potter.

Whilst we were learning about the History of the Maya Civilisation we explored the many different ways in which they were an







advanced society. We also enjoyed making temples and Maya masks. Do you know who is behind the masks?

This half term Class 5 have enjoyed learning all about the Ancient Mayan Civilisation. We have done some fantastic work about the daily life, the pyramids and the gods. We were impressed with how advanced their civilisation was. In Art we designed and created our own Mayan masks and in DT we used 3D nets to create our own Mayan Pyramids.







In English we have been learning all about the great Explorer Ernest Shackleton and his expedition to the Antarctic. We have really enjoyed learning about his adventure and we have done some fantastic narrative writing about different parts of his journey. We took part in a drama lesson and played the role of different crew members when they arrived safely back on land.





In science the Year 6s have been learning all about light. They made their own shadow puppets and investigated how shadows are formed. They have also found out about how light is reflected and also refracted. The Year 5 children have been learning about forces with Miss Potter and they have been investigating how different forces act on objects.
